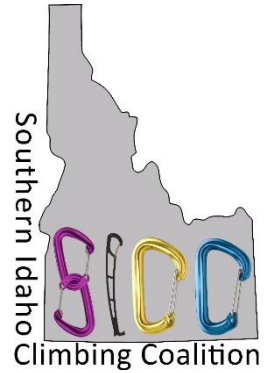


# Southern Idaho Climbing Coalition

### *A Letter from the Chair:*

2017 was indeed a banner year for SICC. Our organization grew by leaps and bounds in a myriad of ways. As I look back on what we accomplished this past year, I am really blown away and amped for what the next year will bring. Here are a few highlights from 2017.

- General SICC membership was created, allowing folks to become members of *their* local climbing organization. Your annual dues help support SICC's mission and give members voting rights for board positions and rebolting projects.
- SICC's first annual fundraising event was in May. Over 60 folks attended this soirée which included a dinner, live auction, raffle, and general good times.
- With the revenue generated at our fundraiser, we were able to purchase and obtain an annual insurance policy that will aid in our attempts to reopen several closed crags on private land.
- Completion of our first rebolting project and the start of our second project. Thanks to our amazing group of volunteers and the Anchor Replacement Grant granted by the Access Fund and American Alpine Club, we were able to sustainably rebolt all 17 routes at the Prow. This big crag now boasts solid stainless steel hardware that should last for another 50+ years!
- In May, SICC hosted a small service crew from Clif Bar who worked on improving the trail and cairns leading to Roman Wall.
- We continued to build a healthy and positive climbing community. We hosted our annual BBQ at City Park in September and our first ever Christmas Costume Climb at Gemstone Climbing Gym in December.

I am excited for the coming year and the many things we can accomplish. Thank you all for making SICC a successful climbing organization.

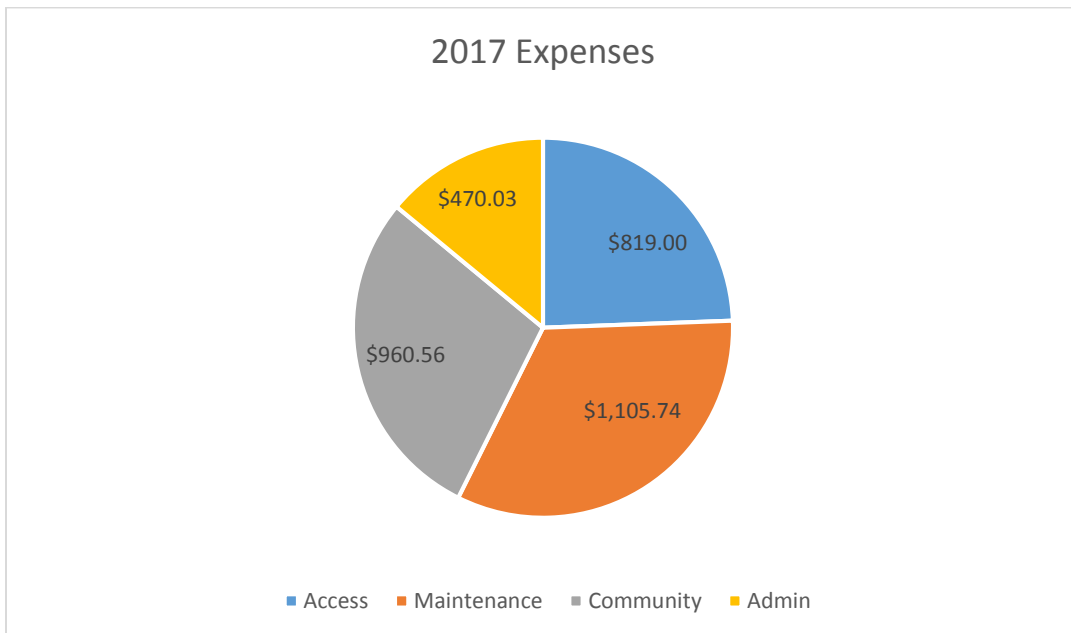
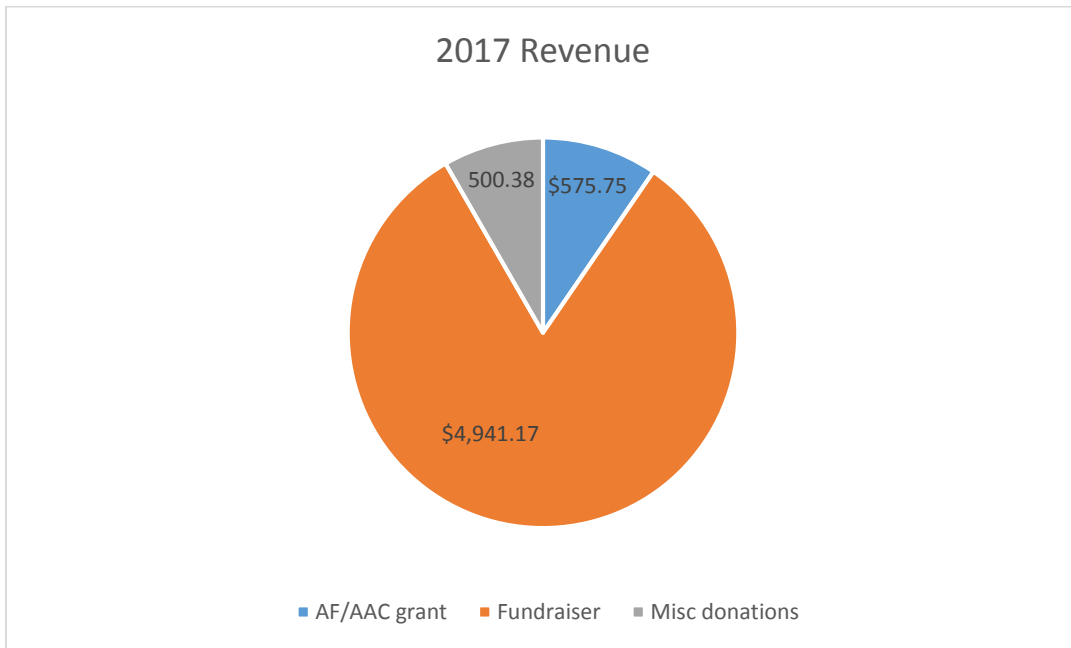
