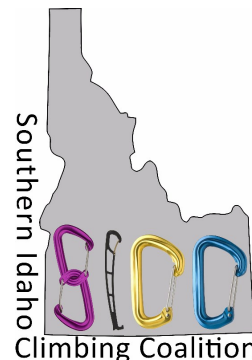

MUSINGS FROM THE CHAIR:

This newsletter is our first attempt to reach our SICCC members and provide updates on what your LCO is doing. We hope this becomes an effective way to communicate with you. We continue to evolve as an organization and are always looking to improve so your suggestions are welcome.

This past year, we increased our overall revenue thanks to your generosity at our annual fundraiser in February. We used a portion of that money to secure an insurance policy which will provide liability insurance to landowners of climbing areas. Two of our climbing areas (Climbers Corral and The Coliseum) are on private land and are currently closed. We are trying to reopen these crags to our climbing community. The process is often slow and frustrating at times, but we hope to do reopen these crags very soon. In the meantime, please respect these closures while we work with the landowners.

As part of our three-fold mission, SICCC also continues to replace aging bolts and anchors at our local crags. After two successful rebolting campaigns at The Prow and Hidden Cliff/Skunk Cave, we are now turning our attention to North Shore. You can help keep our crags safe by reporting any damaged or unsafe bolts to our maintenance chair, Steve Dodd.

And finally, we are always working to ensure our awesomely positive climbing community stays just that. We just hosted our 3rd annual fall potluck and helped out at Dierkes Boulderfest.

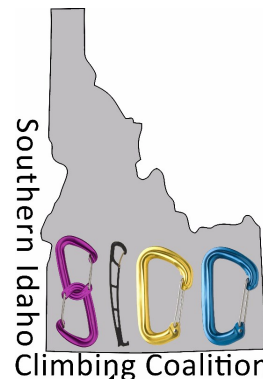
